## **HEALTH PARENT CONSULTATION SURVEY TRENDS**

In June we sent home a survey to all parents consulting them about what our priorities should be for our Health programmes in the next two years.

We received responses from approximately 20 families and some strong themes came through about what these parents felt was important for our students to learn about.

Some of the key themes that emerged from our recent consultation were:

- learning to cope with stress, anxiety, and unhappiness through things like talking things out, mindfulness, exercise and relaxation,
- developing resilience and confidence,
- learning to support others in distress,
- understanding and talking about their feelings and emotions with others they trust,
- inclusion and acceptance of difference,
- keeping safe from unwanted touch,
- what consent means,
- learning to avoid eating too much sugar,
- healthy eating,
- hygiene,
- learning about safety ( fire, water, sun, traffic safety),
- and well-being through regular physical activity.

Thanks to everybody who took the time to write down their ideas. That was really useful for us and we really appreciated you sharing your thinking.

## **BOT STRATEGIC PLANNING**

Caroline Rowe and I are putting together a very brief consultation survey to send home to

all families, hopefully at the end of next week, as we would love to get some direction from families about where they think the BOT and staff should direct our strategic thinking, energy and resources over the next 2-3 years.

We know it is a busy time of year for people so as I say we will try and keep it brief but your responses would be very helpful for us to ensure we are moving in the right direction for our students and community.

### **ERO REPORT HAS NOW BEEN PUBLISHED**

Our ERO report has now been completed after last term's visit and I put it in last week's newsletter for parents to read. It is also available on the ERO website. It states we continue to be a high performing school, using coherent processes and practices that promote equity and excellence. The whole ERO experience was very positive and we enjoyed having the ERO team in our school and having the opportunity to talk to them in depth about our learners and teaching programmes. Thank you to the BOT who were also able to share their focus at a governance level on student achievement also very well.

Ailsa has decided that after 12 or 13 years teaching Te Reo Maori with us she needs to focus more on her main job at Columba College, where she works 3 days a week, and to try and reclaim a bit more work life balance. We are really going to miss Ailsa as she is a wonderfully caring teacher who has done superb work with our students in Maori and Music for such a long time now and she has helped our students to develop a real appreciation of, and love for te reo. Her work with the extension children has been a delight to see, along with her support and guidance for every child and teacher in the school on their Maori language learning journey.

Ailsa sent a note home with her classes this week explaining what is happening and arranging for them to share some kai at the last classes of the year. For Yr3-6 students this will be next Thursday.

We really want to keep our children safe in the sun and teach them good sun safety practices.

You can buy a Macandrew Bay School sunhat from the office for a cost of \$15 so call in and see Irene if you would like to get one. Please name them with a permanent marker inside though so we can get the hat to them if they leave it around the school at any stage.

## **2020 TERM DATES**

Parents are starting to ask us about term dates next year as they start looking ahead and planning for 2020.

As we go through till the 20 December this year we will have our Teacher Only day on Monday the 3<sup>rd</sup> of Feb and start Term 1 on Tuesday the 4<sup>th</sup> Feb.

You log on to lunchonline, place your order and make a payment to cover your costs to lunchonline. It would be great if you could all pay the 20c extra for this option. The Home and School parents have bought bottles of soy sauce for each class so we can avoid the little plastic fish that come with each package too.

### **PIZZA LUNCHONLINE OPTION- 22 NOV**

More dates will be set for pizza lunch orders for Friday the 22<sup>nd</sup> of November. Sushi orders will continue each Wednesday. If your child is sick on the day you have ordered we have heard that you can cancel prior to 9am that day and get your money credited back into your account.

## **FUTURE ENROLMENTS AT MACANDREW BAY SCHOOL**

We need to have up to date information about children who are likely to attend our school in the future and so if you have a pre-school child or know of a neighbour or a friend with a child who plans to send them here in the next few years and who lives within our school zone then please get them to ring or email the school with the child's name, date of birth, address and parent's contact phone number. That would be really helpful for us in planning for the future.

Children usually start coming along for valuable pre- school visits to the New Entrant classrooms about 6 weeks before they are due to start and this helps them transition successfully to school. Get in touch with us here at school about 2 months prior to your child's birthday to get this all arranged.

Numbers have increased at Macandrew Bay therefore Magic can no longer have a casual approach to the bookings, and need you to help them out and book the night before or before 9am on the day, if that is possible please. They check bookings for the day up until 12pm. The sooner they know the numbers for the day the easier it is to call in that extra staff member. Also as Mac Bay is a bit further out of the main Dunedin area, staff coming from the university area need time to organise and travel to the Centre. That is why Magic are asking you to book if needed on the day before 9am, rather than waiting till 12pm.

Please note that Express Bookings need to be "emergency only" (we normally have this option for this reason). All our other Centres parents know this option is for emergencies only. As your Centre has normally had lower numbers we have let this option become the "norm" for bookings. Therefore as above we cannot have this option as a casual basis. We can still express book your child in, but this may result in us being over ratio. Therefore please use this option as a last minute option.

Dear Parent/Caregiver

Public Health South (PHS) is updating schools and Early Childhood Education Centres on the measles outbreak in the Southern District.

There have been no new confirmed measles cases this week. The total number of Southern DHB cases remains at 71.

Total cases for each location to date is:

Dunedin: 2

Oamaru: 1

Wanaka: 3

Queenstown: 64

Gore: 1

The Southern DHB is expecting a delivery of 3,000 extra vaccines next week allowing a widening of priority groups for MMR vaccination.

In the Southern District Health Board region, the priority group for MMR vaccinations has been widened to include catch up MMR vaccinations for all children and young people up to the age of 18 years alongside routine vaccination at 15 months and 4 years.

Unvaccinated children as young as 6 months of age traveling to Auckland or another measles-affected location are also now eligible for MMR vaccination two weeks before traveling.

Primary care practices will be actively recalling those eligible, however, if you know your children are not fully vaccinated with two MMRs then please call your GP practice to make an appointment to be vaccinated.

Immunisation against measles with two doses of MMR vaccine is the best protection and is free for all eligible people. With schools being back in session, we need your help to prevent further transmission of the measles virus.

Public Health South advises that immunisation is the best protection against measles.

**Immunisation is safe, effective and free.**

Measles is serious and highly infectious viral disease that causes fever, cough, sore red eyes and a rash. It can make people very sick. People with measles can be infectious even before they start feeling unwell. While almost all people will make a complete recovery, it can lead to hospitalisation and in rare cases, death.

**Parents/guardians need to find out whether their children are protected against measles.**

Regarding your child's immunisation status:

- **If your child has not received their measles immunisation (MMR vaccine)** as per the Immunisation Schedule (1<sup>st</sup> MMR at 15 months and 2<sup>nd</sup> MMR at four years), call your GP as soon as possible. Arrange a time to immunise your child as it is never too late.
- **Infants and children who are not travelling to Auckland** or overseas to a country with a measles outbreak are recommended to get their MMR vaccinations as per the Immunisation Schedule at 15 months and 4 years.
- **Infants aged 6 to 11 months who are travelling to Auckland** or overseas to a country with a measles outbreak, can have their first MMR vaccination (MMR0) after consulting with their GP, however they will still need to have the MMR vaccinations at 15 months and four years as per the Immunisation Schedule.
- **Infants aged 12 to 14 months who are travelling to Auckland** or overseas to a country with a measles outbreak, should receive all four 15 month vaccinations (MMR, varicella, Hib and PCV10) at least two weeks before travelling to allow immunity against measles to develop.
- **If your child has received only one measles immunisation (i.e. one MMR vaccination)**, call your GP as soon as possible to see if you need to arrange a time to immunise your child with their second MMR. Two measles immunisations provide better protection than one.
- **If your child has received two measles immunisations, or they have definitely had doctor-diagnosed measles infection in the past**, they are considered protected. Over 99% of people who are fully immunised are protected from measles.
- **If you are not sure of your child's immunisation records**, look in your child's Plunket/Well Child Tamariki Ora book or check with your GP.
- **If your child is not immune or you choose not to immunise your child**, they are not protected from measles. If they come into contact with someone with measles, they will likely have to be excluded from school or ECEC for up to 14 days.

**Signs of measles**

It usually takes 10 to 14 days for someone who has caught measles to start showing symptoms.



If your child develops a high fever, runny nose, cough, sore red eyes, or a rash see a doctor (call ahead to alert your doctor about the possibility of measles before visiting and take this letter along).

If your child has a weakened immune system (e.g. if they have an inherited immune problem or are receiving chemotherapy for cancer), please contact your doctor to discuss further.

If this occurs: Call your GP or Healthline (0800 611 116) as soon as possible for advice. Your GP will advise the safest time for your child to return to school. If your GP suspects measles, they will arrange for testing and Public Health South will be in contact to offer support and any follow up regarding contact tracing.
