Mirumiru Tahī (Bubble One)

We have had 6 lovely children join us this week and we may possibly get one or more children next week. It has been really great to work with them and learn together as a group and the children have been enjoying interacting with others outside their family at school.

We decided to call our Bubble class Mirumiru Tahī as Mirumiru is the Maori word for bubble and tahī means 1.

We started writing letters to a friend in their class and hope to send them soon. Here is a letter the children wrote collaboratively to all their school mates at Macandrew Bay School today.

Dear Macandrew Bay Children,

We are the children of Mirumiru Tahī (Bubble 1). We have Sam, Reuben, Lilly, Will, Mila and Rose in our bubble at the moment. How is everyone feeling?

We are feeling good to be at school but we are missing all of you. It's been good to do school work and especially Maths (Mila), playing (Lilly), listening to stories (Rose), playing Prodigy (Sam), scavenger hunt (Will) and some filming (Reuben). It has been good to be with other kids and work and learn together.

We are going to write some letters this week and it would be nice to get some letters or emails from you. I hope the children are reading lots of books at home and enjoying sharing stories within your family.


Hard Copy Learning materials
